On Monday, April 8, 2024, North America will witness a solar eclipse that will momentarily block out the sun. Although San Diego County is not on the path of the total eclipse, the region is expected to witness a partial eclipse that will begin around 10 a.m., peak at 11:11 a.m., and end at 12:23 p.m.

To ensure the safety of all students and staff during this event, Discovery Charter, along with all schools within the Chula Vista Elementary School District will operate on a rainy-day schedule on April 8, with recess and lunch taking place indoors.

Safety is always first, that is why it's important to remember that direct exposure to the sun's rays, especially during an eclipse, poses severe risks to eye health. Even a partial eclipse can cause irreversible eye damage without proper precautions.

Please speak to your child about the below safety tips:

- We should never look at the sun.
- Viewing any part of the bright sun directly or without the use of certified solar eclipse glasses will cause severe eye injury.
- Sunglasses are not enough protection to view the solar eclipse.
